For over 80 years, Clark College has been a center for opportunity in Southwest Washington. Half of Clark College's students are in academic transfer programs, which prepare them for success at four-year colleges and universities. The success rate of the 49% of students who transfer within one year of completing at Clark are more successful than their peers who go directly to a four-year college from high school. Clark students can be found in some of the most competitive academic programs in the region, including major engineering and science programs.

Approximately half of Clark students seek degrees that lead directly to jobs the Greater Portland community. Clark has a wide array of career and technical programs, including the region's largest nursing program. New programs like mechatronics have come directly from partnerships with industry. Every career and technical program at Clark College has an advisory board of industry professionals who help keep the curriculum aligned with employer's needs.

Clark welcomes up to 14,000 students of all ages and backgrounds pursuing their educational or career paths each quarter—making it the largest single-campus provider of for-credit classes in Washington's community and technical college system.
